2nd Annual East Tennessee Opioid Conference

Pain Consultants of East Tennessee co-organized the 2nd Annual East Tennessee Opioid Conference, which took place on Thursday, April 11th in Lenoir City.

More than 300 physicians, nurses, community leaders, and students attended the conference to hear presenters speak about topics including: adverse childhood experiences (ACEs), the science behind addiction, alternatives to treating pain, mindfulness meditation's impact on pain, an update from the Knox County Medical Examiner's Office on the opioid crisis, and primary care provider treatment of pain.



Presenters included physicians from Pain Consultants of East Tennessee, Cherokee Health Systems, The University of Tennessee Medical Center, the Knox County Medical Examiner's Office, and Fadel Zeidan, PhD of the University of California San Diego.

Community Panel members included Karen Pershing, MPH, CPS II, Executive Director of the Metro Drug Coalition, Tommy Farmer, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation Special Agent, Charme Allen, Knox County District Attorney General, and Dr. Mitch Mutter, director of special projects for the Tennessee Department of Health.

The conference was organized by Summit Medical Group, the Metro Drug Coalition, and Pain Consultants of East Tennessee and was sponsored by Cigna. Medical professionals also had the opportunity to continuing medical education (CME) credits made possible by the Knoxville Academy of Medicine.


Dr. Choo believes the event served an important purpose.
